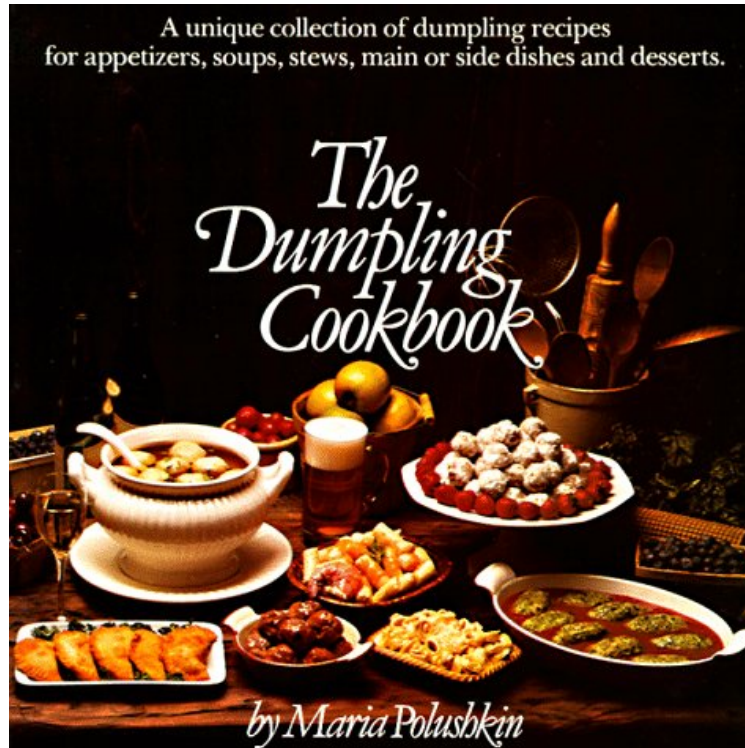

There are NO photos, but some nice line art illustrations.The book does an EXCELLENT job of describing the various types of dumplings, including fritters, dropped, steamed, and baked varieties, savory and sweet. Although the spelling of many foreign versions is somewhat antiquated ("mandoo" instead of "mandu," for example), the background info is solid, and the recipes are pleasantly easy to create, with a minimum of "exotic" versions of ingredients. This does "Americanize" them, somewhat. For example, the Mandu dumplings use sauerkraut instead of kimchi, making it far less spicy.The most important thing this book provides, though, is the statement that "the history of dumplings is, more than anything, a history of experimentation." You will learn a lot about dumpling types from all over the world, and will be motivated to try your own stuffings, shapes, and preparation type. That makes this dumpling cookbook a truly excellent value compared to the newer and more expensive versions full of color photographs!0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
