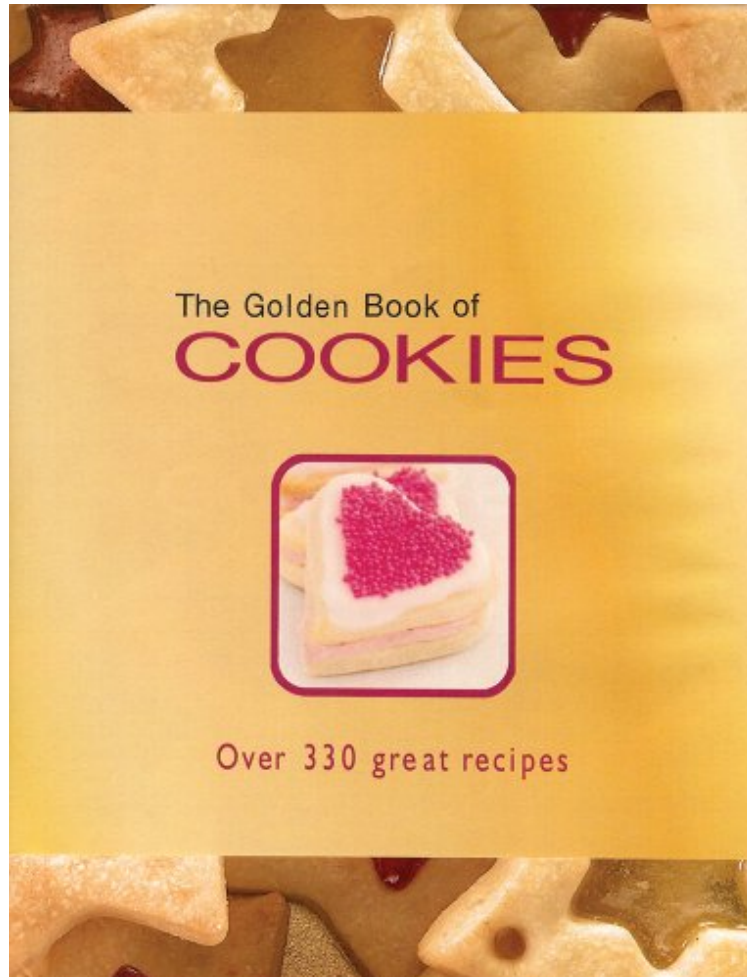

In particular, I recommend the "walnut crisp cookie", which has ground walnuts (I've made it with pecans with equal success) and instant coffee grains. (I used folgers instant, not some snobby espresso). No eggs. Lovely, crisp, and the flavor improved as they were stored. I think the secret of this book is that it is a European/British product originally, and the cookies are closer to their "biscuit" than our soft/sweet American cookies. They freeze beautifully, and the recipes make a limited number (18?) so it is possible to experiment with a number of recipes. I only hope the fates let me stick around long enough to try most of them!! (And PS: to the writer of the only other review: Brownies belong in

the cookie category, owing to their texture, baking format and serving shape.
