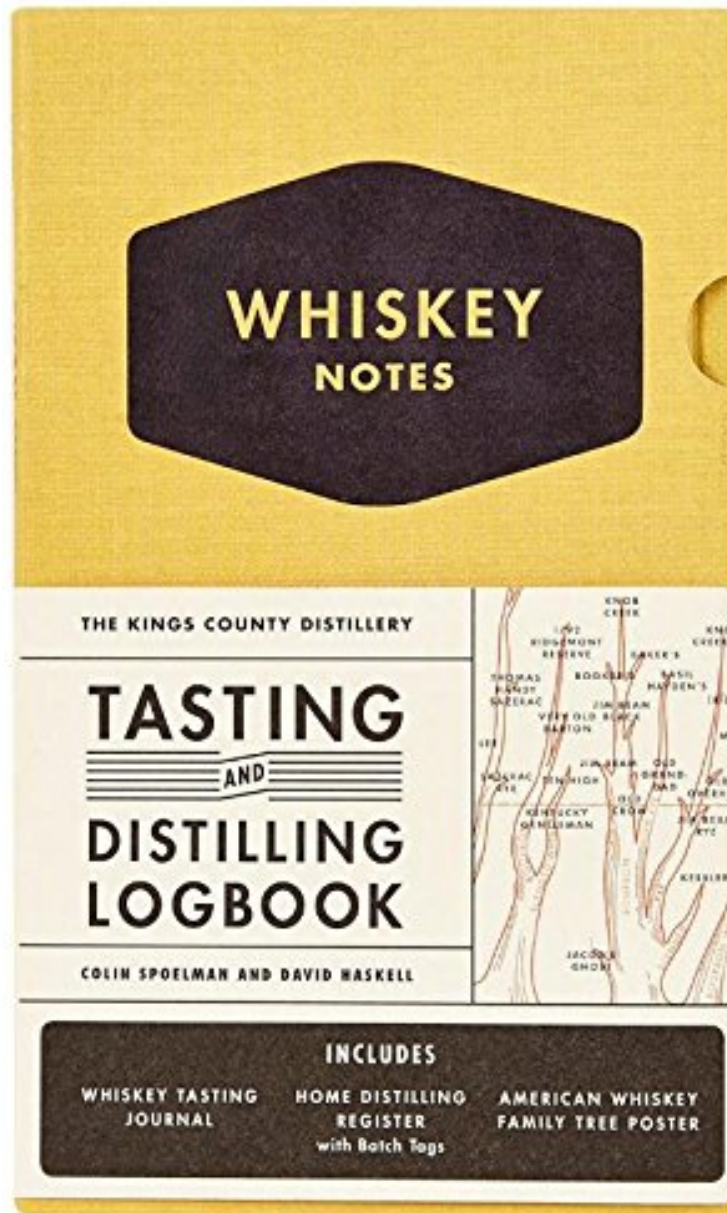

For the book, I found that it could really use a couple of extra categories like Nose, Palate, Finish, etc. They left that out but i guess maybe that's why there's an Observation section. It's pretty standard. It offers 1 page per whiskey, lines for Whiskey Name, Distiller, Proof, Date and Location, Type, Price, Age, and Color. a Notes section that has 10 check boxes ranging from Floral to Honey with 3 spectrums for Sweet/Dry, Delicate/Bold, and Smooth/Intense. It has the mentioned Observation table with 7 lines for notables, and lastly, it has an Evaluation section which offers check boxes for recommendations and expectations, a total score box (1 to 10), and a Single Word line to describe the whiskey. Observation section is nice but still, I'm not sure why they left out Nose, Palate, Finish, etc. Those are pretty obvious things when doing whiskey tastings.Overall, it is good quality and will stand up with time. The pages are not numbered but i counted 80 logging pages.The Distilling Logbook doesn't apply to me so I cannot comment on it. I have read others saying that there isn't enough, which leads me to believe that it's way too standard and people looking for a distilling book may want to look elsewhere.0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
