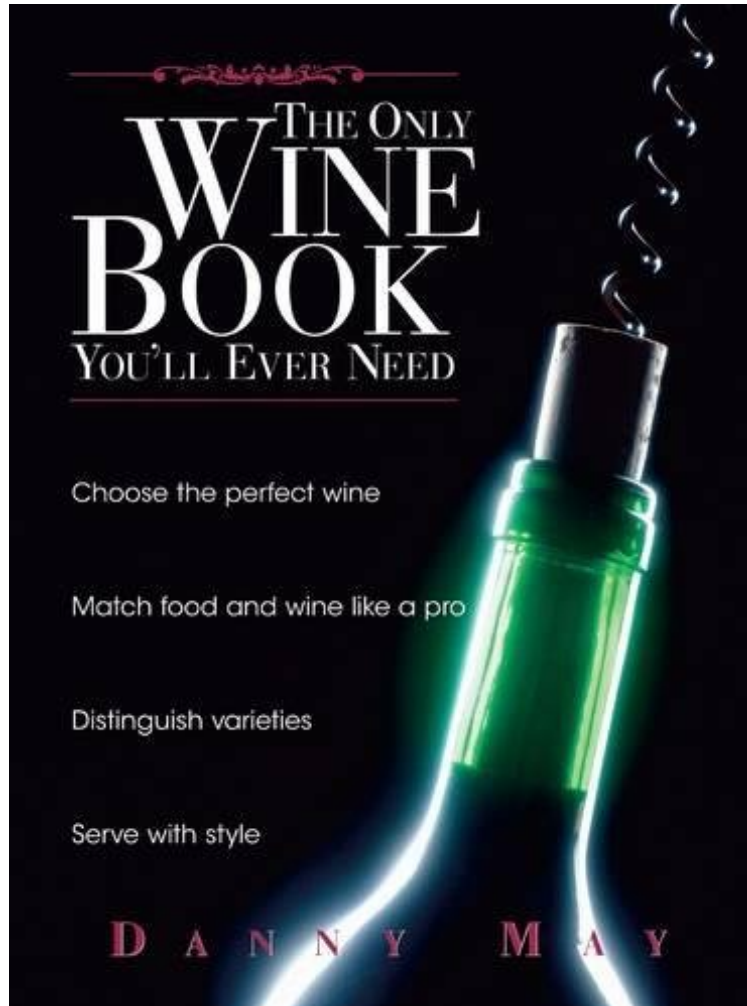

The first word after each bullet point (which is typically the classification discussed by the paragraph that follows) is **MISSING** or represented by only a letter. Kindle version of this book. I enjoyed reading it, but yes there is a big BUT. I guess that during the conversion to the Kindle version some parts of words were lost and only some letters left. And this not few times but many many many times making the lectures sometime a guessing exercise. So for example in the explanation of the different Champagne levels of sweetness we have: B indicates an added sugar content of 15 (Where maybe that B we can guess to be read as Brut) E D is slightly sweeter (Where E D maybe is what was left from the term Extra Dry) D (For Dry ?) B B (For who knows!) And these "Left behind" are all over the Book: The Glossary is just a big collection of them. So interesting book, but it should have been checked if during the conversion to the Kindle version something went wrong. So yes I would like to have my money back, or a fixed version of it SOON. Huge amounts of information are missing because of it. But even without the formatting error, there are a lot of better wine books out there. The organization of this book is lacking. The writing style is okay, but not terribly engaging. It's not clear enough to be useful to a novice, and not interesting enough to be useful to anyone who knows something about wine.
