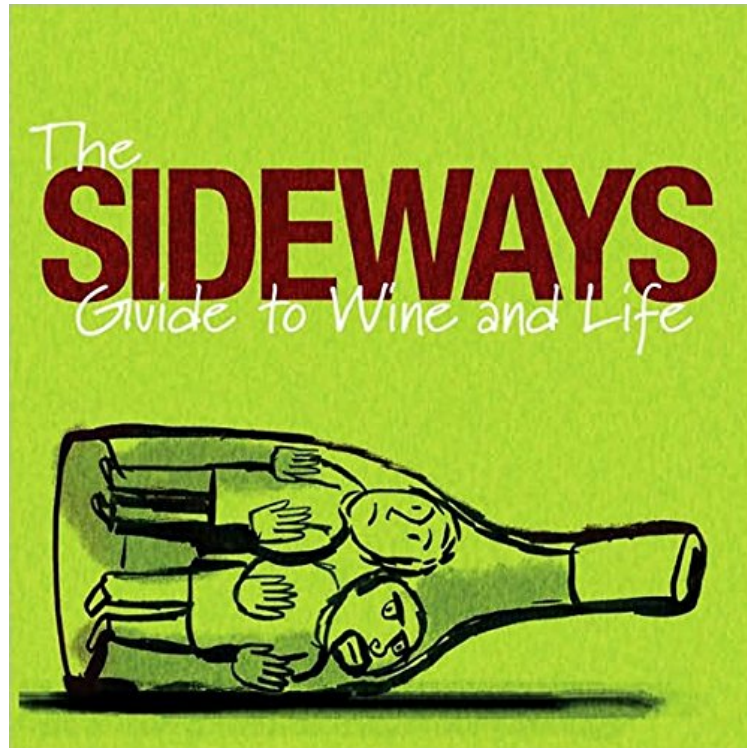

A page near the back titled "A Conundrum" mentioned something I had been wondering about from the movie. At the initial interaction with Stephanie, she pours for Jack and Miles and brags about their straight Cabernet Franc. After quickly tasting it Miles says he "I've come to never expect greatness from Cab Franc, and this one's no different." Yet his "star" in his "gathering in his closet" is a Cheval Blanc. The Wine Spectator's Essentials of Wine, says Cabernet Franc is "a Bordeaux blending grape, it stars on its own in a few Bordeaux wines (most notably Chateau Cheval Blanc)... " I wondered if it was just a mistake in the movie. But this booklet asks the provocative question: "What do you treasure in your own life that you secretly despise?" I guess the bottom line is we are all contradictory. The movie is about relationships and humans can be very contradictory when it comes to them. At 64 pages (that are the size of a CD case) with a random missive sprinkled among the illustrations, the implication here is that (on one level at least) there's not much to "Wine" or "Life." There was a Wine documentary on CNBC last year in which Carl Quintanilla asked the buyer for a major chain store what she was writing in her notes while she was sampling a wine. She replied "That it tastes good." I love that! He was expecting her to say something esoteric about the tannins, mouthfeel or finish. The message is buy and drink what YOU like and ignore the "wine snobs." Most people take themselves and life too
