recipes, especially Arrigo Cipriani's very humorous recipe for the martini he made world-famous at Harry's Bar in Venice, Italy, and the one for a Ramos Fizz *sigh*The first 2/3 of the book focuses on the history, art and craft of making gin and is filled with scores of new and vintage photos and illustrations. The remaining 100+ pages are dedicated to descriptions of currently available gins, boutique and otherwise. This is a beautifully designed book, as well - the cover, the spine, and all parts within.
