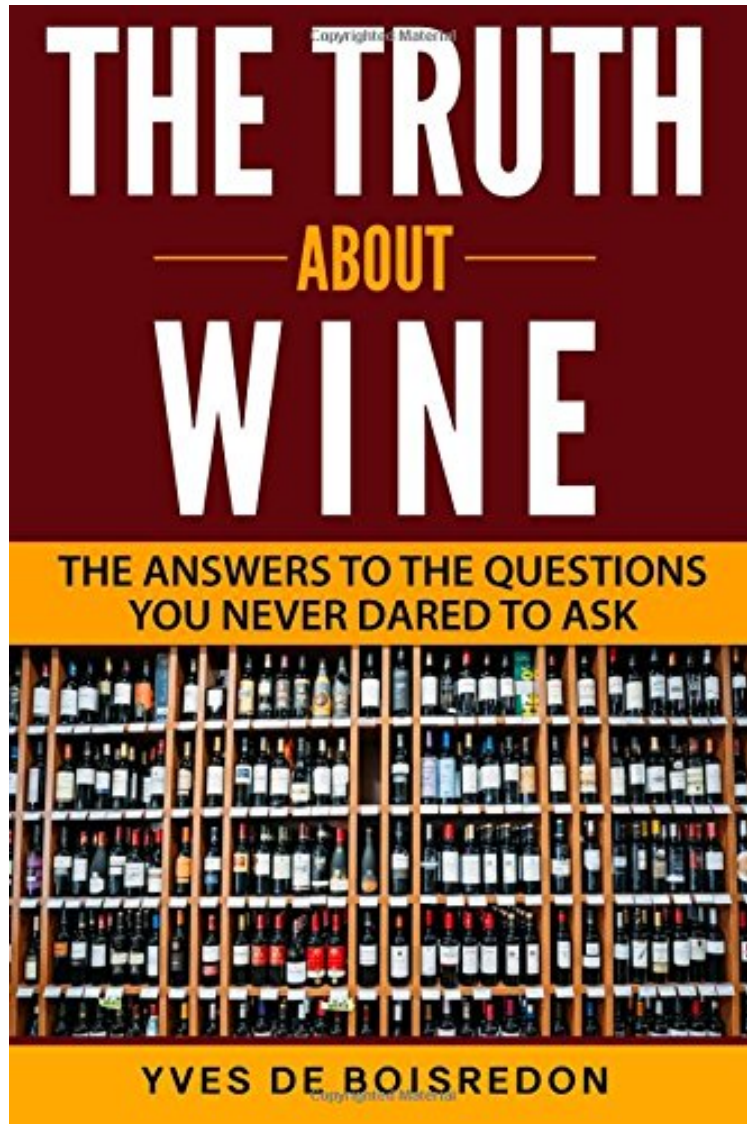

After having read thru the book I went online at Friar Tucks and used the handy search feature to select some wines suggested by the author for us to enjoy of a more moderate price if possible : My choices included: 1) DOMAINE DE LA SOLITUDE COTES DU RHONE 87% rating 4.5 out of 5 stars \$15.99 per 750 ml bottle 2) MOSELLAND RIESLING SPATLESE 84% rating 4 out of 5 stars \$11.99 per 750 ml bottle 3) DOMANIE DE CARTERESSES TAVEL 2015 90% rating 4.5 out of 5 stars \$16.99 per 750 ml bottle 4) CASTELL-CASTELL SYLVANER TROCKEN 87% rating 4.5 out of 5 stars \$14.99 per 750 ml bottle.
