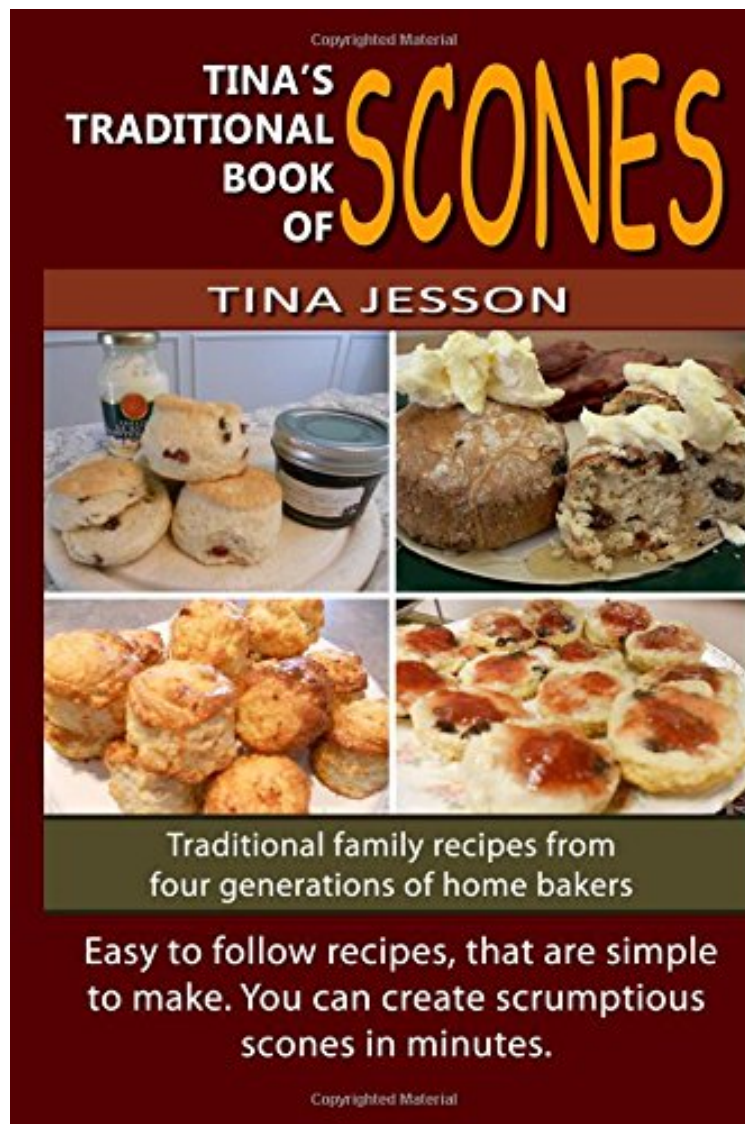

The central character is Oliver, aptly named for his resemblance to the character of Oliver Twist, who faces one tragedy after another. The novel takes place during the late 1800s, mostly in Canada, mostly in the winter, only adding to the tragedy.Oliver is sent to live on the Pritchard farm where he gains an ally and almost motherly figure in Mrs. Pritchard, as she too suffers at the abusive hand of Mr. Pritchard. I say almost because Mr. Pritchard is at every corner blocking her attempts to be a true mother to Oliver. The tragedy in this book comes in layers.The main culprit of the story is Mr. Pritchard, a troubled man, who as in most cases takes his troubles out on others.I commend the author in her portrayal of Oliver and his brother Simon's dialect. I was surprised that "thee" was used by the British, another learning experience. I had to train my brain not to think along the lines of Amish or Quaker while reading the dialect.While the cover fits the book and the composition is good, it is not one that would draw me in. This is mainly due to its bleakness. As an artist I need a splash of color. A splash of color did come for most concerned at the end.
