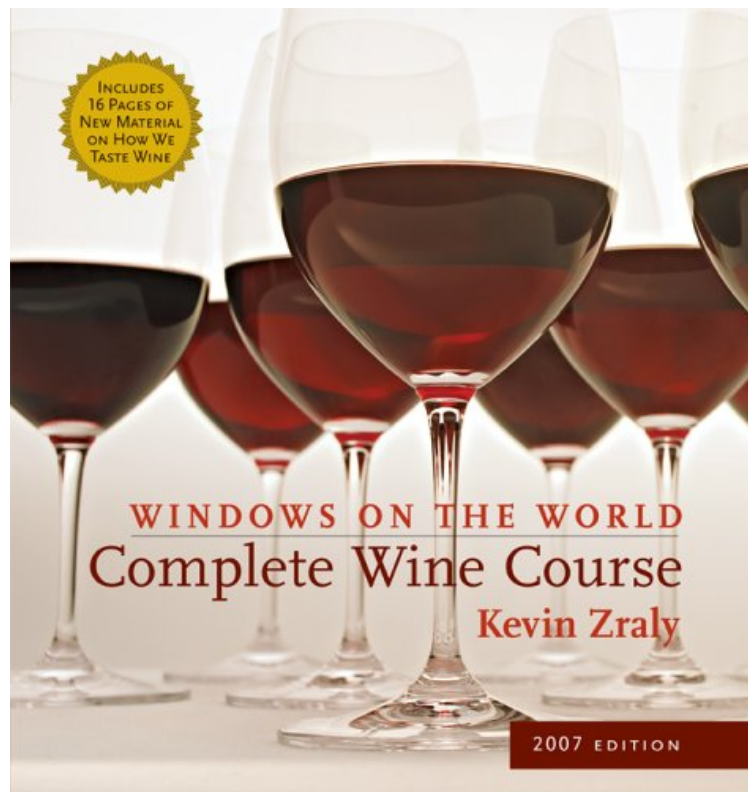

are better for that purpose, such as MacNeil's Wine Bible or Hugh Johnson's World Atlas of Wine.
